Marin Access Catch-A-Ride Pilot Program Update



Timeline

2012

- Catch-A-Ride program launch
- Subsidized taxi program offers additional mobility options to those 65+ and not eligible for ADA paratransit

• July 2020

- Program adjustments made to reflect premium nature of service
- Base fare of \$4 added
- Addition of Marin Access Fare Assistance

• July 2023

- 12-month pilot program to revamp and enhance the Catch-A-Ride (CAR)
- Elimination of call center + addition of Uber as a provider

July 2024

- Initial pilot program evaluation completed
- Pilot extension approved by MCTD Board of Directors



Evaluation Findings

The program expands mobility for Marin Access riders, particularly those with income barriers

Key Areas for Improvement

- 1. Program administration for paper vouchers is burdensome and costly
- 2. There are some provider challenges that diminish the rider's experience
- 3. It is unclear whether the program will be financially viable long term in current form
- 4. Riders desire more flexible options to use the subsidy provided by the District

Progress Update – Items Underway

- Monitoring plan to ensure the program provides equivalent service for all per ADA regulations anticipated implementation in September 2024
- Streamlining the voucher distribution process anticipated update November 2024, implementation in 2025
- Review of fare policy and voucher reimbursement anticipated update in 2025

- Paratransit Coordinating Council: The Marin Paratransit Coordinating Council advises on the need
 and availability of transportation services for Marin's disabled and senior residents. The PCC
 includes senior and disabled consumers of paratransit services, as well as paratransit providers and

- Marin Mobility Consortium: The purpose of the Marin Mobility Consortium (MMC) is to serve as a partnership of agencies serving the senior, disabled and low-income transportation-dependent populations of Marin County with the focus on implementing a coordinated approach to planning, funding, promoting, enhancing, and facilitating access to transportation services for this populace. The MMC will serve in an advisory role to the Marin Transit in the planning and coordination of supplemental transportation services for the senior, disabled and low-income populations of the county. https://marintransit.org/advisory-committees



Changes to MMC Format & Schedule

- Given overlap in content presented at Marin Paratransit Coordinating Council and Marin Mobility Consortium + addition of regular focus groups, staff are making changes to the format of MMC and the meeting schedule.
- Starting in 2025:
 - MMC will shift to bi-annual meetings
 - Meetings will be longer format
 - Staff will facilitate in depth discussion about the needs of senior, disabled, and lowincome transit dependent populations of Marin County.



Marin Access Performance Metrics




Marin Access Ridership Trends






Catch-A-Ride Pilot Program Ridership






Volunteer Driver Program Ridership




