FY 25/26 State Budget

- FY 25/26 transit funding cuts avoided with final budget
- Decision to extend the Cap and Trade (Cap and Invest) program deferred
 - Uncertain future beyond FY 25/26 for programs like TIRCP, Affordable Housing and Sustainable Communities (AHSC), and Low Carbon Transit Operations Program (LCTOP)
- Two-year \$750 million emergency loan to address fiscal emergencies for AC Transit,
 BART, Caltrain, and SF Muni



WTS Employer of the Year

- Marin Transit awarded 2025
 Employer of the Year
- Acknowledged for being a supportive, collaborative and innovative place to work and learn
- Staff is 67% women
- 75% of director level staff are women





Caltrans SR-131/Tiburon Blvd SHOPP Project

- Provided comment letter March 14th
 - Focus on bike/ped/bus safety elements
- Attended workshop June 4th
- Caltrans proposes to phase the project and preserve funding
 - Address basic needs in the first phase
 - Second phase provides additional features
- Caltrans to meet with affected parties
