What is Marin Transit?

The Marin County Transit District (Marin Transit) was established by a vote of the people in Marin County in 1964 and was given the responsibility for providing local transportation services within Marin County.

What is Marin Access?

Marin Transit formed Marin Access in 2010 to focus on the problems of transportation for anyone who cannot or chooses not to drive.

Marin Access programs are funded by Marin County's Measure B, developed by Marin Transit, and operated by contractors including MV Transportation, West Marin Senior Services, and Whistlestop.

Marin Access offers a family of programs to suit your transportation needs!

Marin Access offers older adults and people with disabilities a variety of options for getting around without driving.

If you are 65+, or eligible for Paratransit, and a resident of Marin you are eligible for Catch-A-Ride and Volunteer Driver Programs.

If you cannot ride the public bus due to a disability, you can apply for Marin Access Paratransit.

Paratransit



Marin Access Paratransit provides pre-scheduled bus transportation for persons with disabilities who cannot independently use regular Marin Transit or Golden Gate Transit bus service some or all of the time.

With this service, riders who cannot access our regular fixed routes can still maintain their freedom to travel around Marin.

Paratransit service is available during the same days and hours as our local bus service, within 3/4 mile of the routes. We offer a shared ride, door-todoor service as well as subscriptions for passengers who make regular trips to the same destination.





The Catch-A-Ride program offers taxi rides at a discounted rate within Marin County.

Marin residents who are 65+, or ADA riders are eligible for Catch-A-Ride.

As a Marin Access client, you can receive up to \$14 subsidy towards your ride for up to ten discounted taxi rides per month.

Advance reservations are required.

Low-Income **Fare Assistance** (LIFA)

Marin Access clients who are either enrolled for Medi-Cal, or demonstrate annual income at or below the current Elder Economic Index will be eligible for Low-Income Fare Assistance.



Volunteer Driver

Give back to the people who help get you around!

Mileage reimbursement for up to 100 miles per month for STAR (East Marin), and up to 400 miles per month for TRIP (West Marin)

\$0.60 per mile mileage reimbursement available for you to share with a driver of your choice.

Marin residents who are 65+, or ADA eligible are eligble for Volunteer Driver.



LIFA offers low-income riders \$20 of credit per month to use for trips on Catch-A-Ride and local Paratransit.

Eligible riders can sign up to receive a free Marin Transit local bus pass.



Connect

Marin Transit Connect is an on-demand accessible service that operates generally within 2.5 miles of all SMART stations in Marin County.

Marin Access clients qualify for \$3 fares per trip; general public trips cost \$4 per mile.

Trips on Connect can be booked on the same-day through the Uber app or by calling the scheduling line.
